1. Humanitarian situation

Since the escalation of violence in October 2023, HI and its partners have been relentlessly delivering emergency life-saving support to vulnerable populations in the occupied Palestinian territory. From October 2023 to September 2024, the Ministry of Health in Gaza reported at least 100,000 Palestinians injured, 41,500 killed, and around 10,000 are considered to be under the rubble¹.

According to a WHO report covering January to May 2024, approximately 15,000 people with major extremity injuries, with 3,000 to 4,000 potential amputations, over 2,000 suffering major head and spine injuries, and more than 2,000 severe burn cases².

A recent analysis by the World Health Organization³ found that around 25% of all those injured in Gaza are likely to have acute and ongoing rehabilitation needs with a strong possibility of developing a long-term disability. This includes patients with major extremity injuries, amputations, head and spine injuries and burns.

This percentage is in addition to the 21% of people already living with disabilities prior to the events in October 2023.

During winter, inadequate shelter, shortages of clothing, and limited humanitarian access further exacerbate the crisis. Over 2 million Palestinians in Gaza lack protection, access to food, clean water, sanitation, shelter, healthcare, education, electricity, and fuel. The psychological toll is immense, with many exhibiting trauma and mental health issues. Immediate humanitarian aid, infrastructure repair, and economic support are urgently needed with over 1 million children in need of mental health and psychosocial support.

90% of Gaza's current population of 2.1 million people has been displaced multiple times since October 7 and is in dire condition, amid the continued spread of skin diseases and an acute lack of medications⁴.

As of 1 October, 2024, according to the Ministry of Education, 10,500 students and 400 educational staff have been killed in Gaza, while over 16,250 students and 2,500 teachers have been injured since the escalation of hostilities on 7 October^{5.} Schools have been closed all the former academic year and used as shelters: as the hostilities and displacements continue, students are likely to lose another year of classes. Health facilities continue to face severe supply shortages due to obstacles hindering the entry of humanitarian aid and a growing backlog of health supplies

and equipment awaiting entry into Gaza. 19 out of 36 hospitals in Gaza are out of service.

In the West Bank, including East Jerusalem, violence has escalated significantly since 2023: heightened tensions, increased Palestinian casualties, rising settler violence, and the demolition of Palestinian-owned structures have fuelled the crisis. Increased restrictions on movement and access compound widespread displacement and loss of livelihoods. According to OCHA, between 7 October 2023 and 30 September 2024, 695 Palestinians were killed in the West Bank, including East Jerusalem⁶, an average of 2 each day. During the same period, OCHA documented about 1,423 attacks by Israeli settlers against Palestinians: 140 led to Palestinian casualties, 1,135 to damage to Palestinian property, and 148 to both casualties and property damage⁷. Since 7 October 2023, 277 Palestinian households comprising 1,628 people, including 794 children, have been displaced in Bedouin and herding communities across the West Bank, primarily citing attacks by Israeli settlers and impeded access to grazing lands by settlers⁸. On 28 August 2024, The Israeli military has launched its largest invasion of the occupied West Bank in decades, targeting multiple cities, including Jenin, Nablus, Tubas, and Tulkarem. Israeli forces have closed all entrances to the northern West Bank, obstructed ambulances from reaching the injured, and threatened hospital raids.

Since 7 October 2023, the Israeli authorities have imposed additional restrictions on the movement of 3.3 million Palestinians across the West Bank, including East Jerusalem, in the form of physical obstacles or restricted access regulations^{9.} These restrictions disconnect cities, villages, and communities, hampering access to essential services and disrupting humanitarian aid delivery.

Closures and enforced shutdowns of health facilities have disrupted healthcare services, limiting patient access to critical care. Militarized searches of health facilities have compromised staff safety and further disrupted the delivery of healthcare. Additionally, demolitions and structural damage have destroyed health infrastructure, rendering many facilities inoperable or significantly impaired, disrupting the continuity of medical services. The use of force and instances of detentions have targeted healthcare workers, subjecting them to physical aggression and detainment, which impedes their ability to provide essential care to those in need.

Since October 2023, visa and permits for humanitarian workers have been suspended: international staff cannot establish a regular presence in the country, needed to support the emergency response, and national staff of the West Bank have been restricted movements to both East Jerusalem and Gaza.

Summary of HI presence in the country

HI has been working in Palestine since 1996 with its main mandate being to support disability organisations. In 1999, the organisation set up first anti-personnel landmines and other explosive remnants of war education initiative. A large number of development initiatives have been run since then in a number of fields in partnership with local associations: functional rehabilitation (technical assistance, equipment, training, and publications), psycho-social support, empowerment of people with disabilities organisations, and local inclusive development, access to education and access to employment. Following the summer 2014 humanitarian crisis in Gaza, HI complemented its development intervention with emergency and post emergency response in the fields of rehabilitation, reconstruction and anti-personnel landmines and other explosive remnants of war risk reduction.
